

Nicolai Rosager Weber, DVM, PhD, Danish Agriculture & Food Council

Nicolai Rosager Weber is a Manager at the Danish Agriculture & Food Council, where he heads the Pig Health & Veterinary Data unit. He holds a veterinary degree from the University of Copenhagen and has a combined background in practical herd management and research on porcine intestinal diseases. He also serves as an external examiner and co-PhD supervisor at the University of Copenhagen.

Nicolai spent seven years as a veterinary pig practitioner in the Danish pig industry before working as a researcher at the University of Copenhagen. In 2017, he completed his PhD thesis, *Porcine Intestinal Disease Complex in nursery pigs, with special focus on the prudent use of antimicrobials*.

Throughout his career, Nicolai has worked across research, advisory services, and the management of large-scale health initiatives in the Danish pig industry. His work focuses on herd health, antimicrobial use, and data-driven approaches to improving animal health and production systems. Since 2022, he has also managed the Danish national PRRS reduction program, coordinating efforts to improve disease control and strengthen biosecurity across the pig sector.
